Parental supervision is advised and required while surfing the internet.



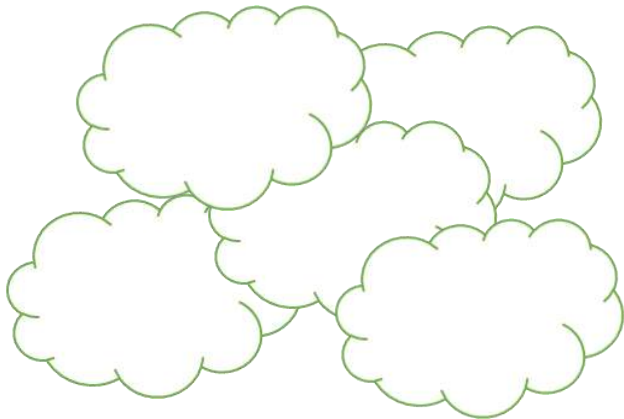

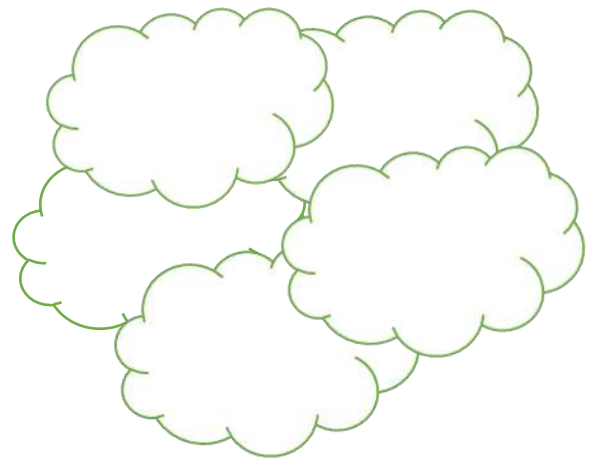
ENGLISH

The Brahmin wanted to know what she had in mind. The girl pointed to a dirty pool where her pigs were wallowing and told him that if he had real faith in his heart and if he had complete trust in her, he should dip into the pool, and she would bring about the exact auspicious moment of the full moon, and he, in turn, would earn all the merit of bathing in the Ganges. The Brahmin dived into the pool and found the bottom full of jewels and brought out a handful of them. The girl wanted him to dive again and he did so once more. This time he found mud at the bottom. 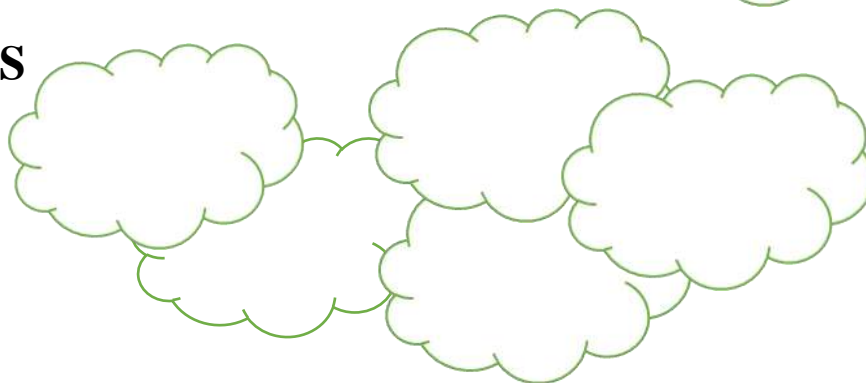

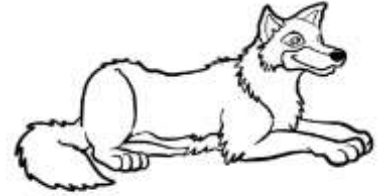


ACTIVITY 2 - THE JUNGLE BOOK

- 1) Akela (Akelā also called The Lone Wolf or Big Wolf) is a fictional character in **Rudyard Kipling's stories, The Jungle Book (1894)** and **The Second Jungle Book (1895)**. He is the leader of the Seeonee pack of Indian wolves and presides over the pack's council meetings. Akelā means "single or solitary" in Hindi. Kipling also calls him the Lone Wolf Kipling portrays. He is large and grey and leads the pack by virtue of his strength and cunning.



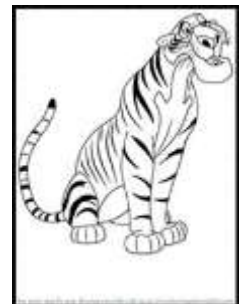
- 2) Baloo is a fictional character in **Rudyard Kipling's, The Jungle Book (1894)** and **The Second Jungle Book (1895)**. Baloo, a sloth bear, is the strict teacher of the cubs of the Seeonee wolf pack. His most challenging pupil is the "man-cub" Mowgli.



- 3) Bagheera is a fictional character in **Rudyard Kipling's, The Jungle Book (1894)** and **The Second Jungle Book (1895)**. He is a black panther (melanistic Indian leopard) who serves as friend, protector and mentor to the "man-cub" Mowgli. The word Bagheera is Hindi for panther or leopard, although the root word 'bagh' means tiger



- 4) Shere Khan is a fictional Bengal tiger and the main antagonist in **Rudyard Kipling's, The Jungle Book (1894)** and **The Second Jungle Book (1895)**. The name roughly translates as tiger ruler, with 'shere', being the Persian word for 'tiger' and khan being used as a title of distinction among the Turco-Mongol peoples, usually meaning chief or ruler. According to The Kipling Society, the name "shows that he is the chief among tigers."

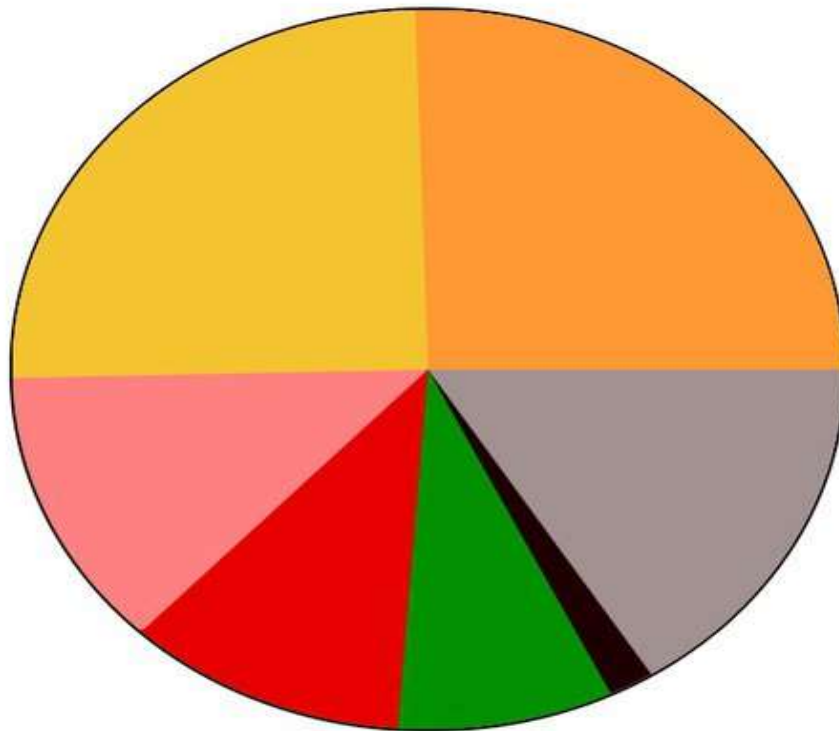

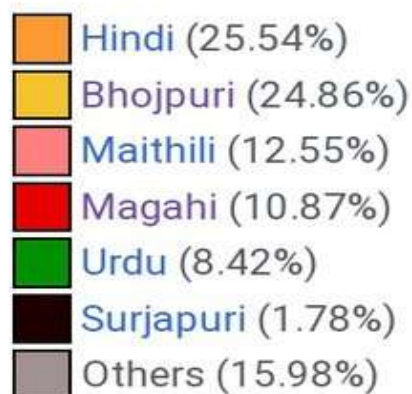
